38. Thin Air Head Bonus

50 - 75 – 100 – 125 - 150 points

During a Thin Air TT rally we could always count on a set of bonuses that progressively were worth more points. So, in honor of the Thin Air Heads, for this bonus, travel to the visitor centers in the National Parks and Monuments in Colorado and obtain a round National Park Passport stamp with the park name, date, and location. Only one stamp per visitor center and no stamps with duplicate locations.

From the following list of Parks and Monuments, the first stamp is worth 50 points, the second 75, the third 100, etc. The list: Bents Old Fort, Black Canyon of the Gunnison, Colorado, Dinosaur, Florissant Fossil Beds, Great Sand Dunes, Mesa Verde, and Rocky Mountain.

This is a timed bonus. The operating hours vary from one visitor center to another. Some open as early as 8 AM. Some don't close until 6 PM. Others open later. Others close earlier. Plan ahead or live adventurously.

If you don't have a National Park Passport book you may want to purchase one and start a collection of park stamps. It's very addicting and will take you to many a park or monument that you might not have visited otherwise.

The Two-Bits Rally, like the Iron Butt Rally, "is dedicated to the sport of safe, long-distance motorcycle riding. It does not condone, nor will it tolerate, unsafe activities such as excessive speed, reckless motorcycle operation, riding while fatigued or otherwise impaired, the use of stimulants to maintain alertness, or any other activity that results in riders exceeding their personal limits. Any rider found to have engaged in these or other unsafe activities, as determined in the sole discretion of the" Two-Bits rally master "shall be subject to disqualification."
